

RESIDENTIAL RESILIENCE GRANT

Funding Application

Building disaster resilience is a critical aspect of Rocky View County's sustainability. Disaster resilience is the ability of a community to resist, absorb, accommodate, adapt to, transform, and recover from the effects of a hazard in a timely and efficient manner, including through the preservation and restoration of its essential basic structures and functions through risk management.

Understanding this, Rocky View County developed a Regional Resilience Project in partnership with the Canadian Red Cross Society in order to build the region's resilience and to improve our ability to prepare for, respond to, and recover from disasters. As a part of this project, grants are being provided to individual households to build their resilience to fires and floods by offering fire and flood home protection assessments and improvements.

After receiving an assessment, residents can apply for home improvement grants by completing and submitting this form along with a copy of your home assessment.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must:

- Be residents of Rocky View County, the Village of Beiseker or the Town of Crossfield.
- Had a certified fire and/or flood home protection assessment completed in the last year with recommendations on improvements. The recommendations should match the improvements requested in this application.

Mandatory Attachments:

- 1. A completed Residential Resilience Grant Application Form.
- 2. FireSmart and/or flood home protection assessment report.

Application Review Process and Timelines:

- Application Deadline: July 30, 2022 (4 p.m.)
- The County Selection Committee will review all requests, and applicants will be advised of the Committee's decision within six weeks of the application submission.

Obligations Upon Receiving Grant:

- Grant recipients will receive a Grant Agreement Letter outlining the approved grant amount, including specific items approved or denied, and the project goals and outcomes expected.
- Improvements need to be completed by a certified contractor.
- Recipients may only spend grant funds on the specific items approved.
- Recipients must submit a detailed receipt detailing how the money was spent.
- Grant recipients must, at any time, permit a representative of Rocky View County to examine records to determine whether the grant funding has been used as intended and approved.

Appendix A

Applicants can apply for a household maximum of \$9,054.

Grant amounts requested must be based on the needs identified in the fire and/or flood home protection assessment completed on their home.

Applicants applying for flood home protection improvements can apply for the following:

- Roof Cleanliness Gutters Cleaned \$454 per household for a maximum of 150 homes.
- Seal cracks in foundation walls and floors \$2,000 per household for a maximum of 50 homes.
- Window wells and well coverings \$3,000 per household for a maximum of 50 homes.
- Disconnect Downspouts \$1,000 per home for a maximum of 50 homes.
- Back Water Valve Installation \$1,000 per household for a maximum of 50 homes.


Applicants applying for fire home protection improvements can apply for the following:

• Tree removal in zone 1 and 1a only, which is the area 0 to 10 meters from your home (see picture below). Maximum of \$1,500 per household for a maximum of 100 homes.






Appendix B: Flood Hazard Map
