

Addressing in Rocky View

The numbering of the Township/Range Roads is determined by the original Township Survey System of the late 1800's.

Both road and house address numbers increase from south to north and from east to west.

Each mile of road is divided into 260 units, facilitating the addressing of large parcels of land by the location of the intersection of the driveway and the municipal road.

Most addressing in Rocky View was accomplished using aerial photography to determine the driveway location.

The first Township Road to the south or the first Range Road to the east of these intersections defines the prefix number used to address the driveway location.

Most addressing in subdivided areas follows the convention used in urban centres by incrementing neighboring addresses by a count of 4. If parcels are greater than 2 acres in size, increment by 8 to leave room for subdivision.

In all cases, odd numbers are on the west and south and even numbers are on the east and north.
