

Municipal Addressing

Rocky View County has a bylaw requiring the display of your municipal address. This helps the County provide services, and speeds up the response of police, fire, and paramedic personnel in the event of an emergency.

Each County property owner is responsible for ensuring their address is displayed properly and remains visible at all times.

Standards


- Numbers no less than 2.75 inches (70 mm) in height.
- Sign panels must be light-reflective, not less than 8 x 12 inches (20.5 x 30.5 cm).
- Numbers and panel should have strongly contrasting colours.
- In urban areas the address sign or numbers must be posted in a conspicuous place no higher than the first story.
- In rural areas the address sign must be posted in a conspicuous place on a post or fence adjacent to the driveway at the property line.


Sample Signs




Sign Placement



If your house is not visible, or is far from the road, display your address at both the driveway entrance and on your house (especially if sharing a driveway).



Even if your house is fairly close to the road, displaying your address on both the house and at your driveway will help emergency personnel locate your house quickly.



Important – always display numbers horizontally.
