Late payments are subject to penalties.

Tax Installment Payment Plan — TIPP

Ease your annual tax payment burden through TIPP – the monthly payment program.

Through TIPP, you make 12 consecutive monthly property tax payments instead of a single, annual payment due annually on June 30.

- Enroll by June 15
- · No missed deadlines
- · Automatic, monthly bank withdrawals
- · No waiting in line to make payments
- No tax penalties (as long as monthly payments are kept current)

Rocky View County Budget Overview

Rocky View County's 2025 Budget focuses long-term financial health, aligning service levels with community needs, and managing inflationary pressures to keep taxes affordable.

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What You May See on Your Tax Notice:

- Municipal Taxes to support County services
- Other Local Improvements or Special Levies (if applicable)
- Provincial Education Requisition collected on behalf of the Government of Alberta
- Seniors Housing Requisition collected on behalf of the Rocky View Foundation

Where Your Tax Dollars Go

Property taxes account for 78% of the County's total revenue.

The remaining 22% comes from user fees (such as permits and licenses), developer's levies, investment income, reserve funding, provincial grants, traffic fines & tax penalties, and third party infrastructure contributions.

Revenue collected by the County helps fund critical services and infrastructure that residents rely on every day, including:

Property Taxes: The Path from Assessment to Payment

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- Annual property assessments reflect the estimated market value as of July 1 of the previous year, following provincial guidelines.
- Assessors update property information to ensure **fair**, **accurate assessments**.
- **Resident input**, gathered year-round (especially in spring), helps **shape** Council's strategic direction and guides budget decisions and service priorities.
- Assessment notices are mailed in January and can be reviewed with staff if requested.
- Council finalizes the **Tax Rate in April**, based on required revenue to fund County services.
- Tax notices are mailed in May.

Funding Education: 41[¢] of Every Tax Dollar

- Determined by the Province and based on your property's assessed value.
- The County does not control the Education Tax Rate or retain these funds. It is collected on behalf of the Province.

What's Changing in 2025:

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- The Province increased the Total Education Tax requisition to \$3.1 billion, a \$400 million rise from last year.
- · The Provincial Education Tax Rate increases to:
 - \$2.72 per \$1,000 (residential/farmland)
 - \$4.00 per \$1,000 (non-residential)
- County residents face a 25% year-over-year increase in Education Property Taxes combined with property value increases.

Rocky View County continues to advocate for fair taxation and transparent provincial funding to benefit local communities.
